BOOK PROJECT

Mayors in the Middle: Indirect Rule and Local Government in Occupied Palestine

The motivating question of this book is: While under military rule and in the absence of sovereignty, what does self-government look like? This manuscript combines original, local-level data from the West Bank and rich qualitative evidence to show how Israel’s military occupation and approach to annexation has shaped Palestinian political institutions at the local level. While the Israeli-Palestinian conflict has often been treated as *sui generis*, this manuscript inductively develops a general theory of how regimes of indirect rule shape local politics in indigenous communities.*
